Curtis. Drawing on firsthand accounts, archival photographs, and maps, Robert Campbell explores the popular images conjured by these travelers' tales, chronicling how Gilded Age sightseers were inspired by Alaska's bounty of tribal artifacts, geological riches, and novel thrills.
